



DELEGATE ASSEMBLY

What does a delegate do?

As a delegate, you are a voting member of the association – representing your local school board. You will bring forward the ideas and concerns of your constituents, debate and vote on policies, programs, and resolutions; and elect the NDSBA Board of Directors.

How many assembly delegates are there?

The number of delegates allowed for each school board is determined by the number of teachers in the district:

Teachers	Delegates
0-10	1
11-30	2
31 and over	3

A school board is also granted additional delegates based on student population. A school district with 1,000 – 4,999 students is allowed one additional delegate; a district with 5,000 or more students is allowed two additional delegates.

A maximum of five delegates are allowed per district. To have delegates represented at the Annual Convention, a school district must be current on its dues to NDSBA.

How do I become a delegate?

If you are interested in being a delegate to the 2025 Annual Convention, notify your school business manager, who is responsible for certifying your eligibility as a delegate.
